What does the course cover?

The programme is in two parts. Part 1 gives training, advice and guidance on the applicable regulations required for a Level 2 Domestic Electrical Installer. This includes BS7671 (inspection and testing) to the IEE Regs, EAWR's 1989, HASAW 1974, CDM 1994, HS(G)141 and Building Regulations Approved Documents.

Part 2 covers practical and theoretical assessment (examination) of the 9 modules for the Level 2 Domestic Installer Certificate (Part P)

You will require the IEE Wiring Regulations 'On-Site Guide' BS7671:2008 ISBN No 978-0-86341-854-9. We also recommend the NICEIC book 'Electrical Installers Guide to the Building Regulations' ISBN No. 0-95-487910-4. **PPE will be required especially a hard or bump hat.**

A pre-requisite for this programme is to have prior practical experience and fundamental electrical knowledge of installation work in domestic properties.

Who is the course suitable for?

People wishing to take up domestic electrical installation work and following the enrolment onto a competent person scheme, self certify their own work.
