The WATA route to success

The Construction (Design and Management) Regulations requires clients to appoint a Planning Supervisor/Co-ordinator. The revision of the regulations in April 2007 redefined the tasks and duties.

This course explores the effects of the CDM 2007 regulations and the changes that organisations will need to embrace. The new regulations bring together CDM 1994 and the Construction Health, Safety and Welfare Regulations 1996.

It considers the new duties of the client and the revised duties of the CDM Co-ordinator (replacing the Planning Supervisor) and is designed to provide a thorough understanding of and preparation for this new role.
