Noise at Work – Music & Entertainments Industry – 3 Days

From 6 April 2008 the Control of Noise at Work Regulations 2005 will apply to the music and entertainment industry. This course is aimed at those who face this major change in workplace noise control.

What does the course cover?

- The effect of Noise Induced Hearing Loss
- How the ear works
- Measurement scales and units in noise assessments
- Instrumentation for sound measurement
- Noise survey; sound propagation; sound absorption and sound insulation.

- The Noise Management Programme
- Instruments for measuring sound.
- Noise survey procedures and
- A noise survey in a suitably noisy environment simulating clubs, pubs, small auditoria. Delegates will practice acquiring accurate noise data over a range of typical situations.

This is a practical 3 day course that covers the skills and knowledge required to enable an organisation to meet the requirements of the regulations. It also provides a pragmatic guide to current best practice. Extensive use is made of case studies from across the entertainment and music sectors and practical work involves measurement and assessment using both classic and contemporary examples.
